This measure (Regulation 35(1) thereof) provides for the limit of Escherichia coli not to exceed 20 per gm in any article of food or per ml in the case of liquid food, and for no article of food to be contaminated with any pathogenic microorganism. As specified in Regulation 35(2), any food specified in column 1 of the Eleventh Schedule shall comply with the microbiological standard for total count and coliform count specified in columns 2 and 3 of that Schedule, respectively. The objective of this measure is to ensure food safety.

This measure (Regulation 35(3) thereof) provides for the mould count for tomato products. The percentage of positive fields shall for be more than 20% for tomato juice and 40% for other comminuted tomato products, including ketchup, puree and paste. The objective of this measure is to ensure food safety.

This measure (Rule 9(2) thereof) provides for the sanitary standards of imported fresh fruits and vegetables. The sanitary standards are as follows: (a) a consignment of fresh fruits or vegetables, which is to be imported, must not contain any organism or substance (other than a pesticide or toxic chemical) that is likely to be, or of a level that is likely to be, injurious to human health; and (b) the container for the fresh fruits or vegetables constituting the consignment is clean and in a sanitary condition, and is appropriate for the keeping of such fruits or vegetables. The objective of this measure is to ensure food safety.
